All DCs should have gotten a letter from Karol Wilson from the N.O. about this. If not, please notify me immediately.

It is time to vote for our region's representative to the National Youth Congress held at the Annual meeting (to be held in the Carolinas in January). These applications must be at the national office by the 1st of November, so that means CNER must have decided on our representative before then. I am asking that applications be in to me by the 15th of October. That way the Council can look at them and vote on our representative at the meeting on the 18th. If anyone has a deserving C-3 or higher who is 18-21, please have him or her get the paperwork in to me by the 15th.

The Nominating Committee is getting ready for the Annual Meeting of the Region, so if anyone has any comments or questions about our leadership, please feel free to contact Karen Marcotte with them.
