

RALLIES: Requires a site suitable for the activity; courses suitable for the level if rally includes jumping; stabling if an overnight rally; parking for trailers and spectators, hotel proximity or host families if overnight; classrooms for Quiz; food; volunteers.



CLINICS: Requires site suitable for activity; indoor arena is helpful in case of inclement weather; classrooms, meeting rooms, outdoor arena, jump courses suitable for level; parking suitable for trailers, overnight accommodations for clinicians and attendees; meals and snacks; Ds and Cs as demo riders depending on clinic; volunteers.
